sense approach that provides educators and parents easy-to-learn skills that create respect, responsibility and good decision-making in their youth.

Love and Logic rests on four scientifically-based principles:

1. Logical consequences delivered with empathy.
2. Collective thinking and problem-solving.
3. Shared control.
4. Adult-child relationships that build mutual respect and self-esteem.

There are two rules of Love and Logic:


Rule #1 is: Adults set limits without anger, lectures, threats or repeated warnings. When we describe what we will do or allow, that's setting a limit. When we tell a child what he/she should or shouldn't do, that's a possible fight.

Rule #2: When children cause problems, adults hand these problems back in loving ways. We hand the problem back by replacing anger and lectures with a strong dose of empathy fol-

lowed by the logical consequence.

Parents want to enjoy their children, have fun with them, and enjoy a less stressful family life. But even if their kids are trouble-free right now, they fear what the coming teenage years will bring. Many philosophies have been presented over the years. Many sound good but don't seem to do the job of helping children become respectful, responsible, and a joy to be around. Many ideas center around making sure that kids are comfortable and feeling good about themselves in order to have a good self-concept. However, Love and Logic has discovered that self-concept is achieved through struggle and achievement, not through someone telling you that you are number one. Self-confidence is not developed when children are robbed of the opportunity to discover that they can indeed solve their own problems with caring adult guidance.
