Most studies on parental involvement show a high correlation between the level of

the earlier parents are engaged in their children's learning, the more likely that pattern will continue.

We also know that the interaction between parents and early childhood staff is often more regular and more intensive than parent communication in school later. This is partly because the settings may be less formal and partly because parents tend to be particularly concerned about their children's first experiences in group settings.

Every day your child is with us, we partner with you and share in the experience. We want you to view us as your extended family to help share in the challenges and joys of raising your children. Keep in mind that working in partnership with your child's teachers requires daily attention.

Sharing their days is an important part of the open communication that must occur in order the partnership to be successful. We must communicate daily in sharing what is important to you as a parent, and what requirements are

necessary for your child 's success.

This month we will be learning about healthy living with an emphasis on exercise and nutrition. Your worries about whether or not your child is developing good eating habits should be lessened knowing that your child is exposed to a variety of foods at school. Being with other children, especially at different ages, may help your child develop better feeding skills. Checking our menus regularly may help you plan meals for your family that complement what is being served at school.

Celebrating holidays and birthdays can be an opportunity to teach all the children about the different ways families celebrate.

Working together on guiding your child's behavior requires constant communication between home and school. Children need to learn self-control over their behavior so that they will act appropriately when their parent or teacher isn't there. We need to work cooperatively, using the same guidance to help each child be the best they can be!

### Chaplain's Corner - Signs of Easter - Invite a Friend Sunday and Easter Egg Hunt News, too!

This month in Chapel we are exploring the *Signs of Easter*. We talked this morning about the signs outside like today's warm, bright sunshine filling us with the promise of warmer days, the green shoots peeking through the ground telling us that tulips will be blooming soon and the little buds that are starting to make their appearance on the ends of tree limbs. We call this sign – Spring's a-coming. We talked also about the way in which the sanctuary is changing, too. We saw lots of purple that was not there before. There's purple fabric on the communion table and the pulpit, which then leads our eyes to the purple cloth draped on the cross. We call this sign Lent, the church season leading to Holy Week and Easter. We also shared the signs of Easter in our story time, where during these next few weeks we will walk with Jesus to the cross and to the surprise of the empty tomb.

#### New Young 2's Class

#### MEDICATION FORM REQUIRED



NLC will NOT administer a non-prescription medication unless it is accompanied by a physician's request to do so. The center will administer physician-prescribed medication and non-prescription medication only upon the request of the child's parents or guardians on our **"Medication Authorization"** form. Tylenol or other over the counter medication that does not list required dosage, must be accompanied by a doctor's signature. This is a license requirement by the Department of Social Services and must be adhered to.



## Author of the Month

This month's author of the month is Dr. Seuss. Theodor Seuss Geisel (March 2, 1904–September 24, 1991) was an American artist and cartoonist known for his children's books written under the pen name, Dr. Seuss. He published over 60 children's books which were often characterized by imaginative characters, rhyme, and frequent use of trisyllabic meter. His most celebrated books include the best selling Green Eggs and Ham (which the children had for breakfast on his birthday), The Cat in the Hat, and One Fish Two Fish. Numerous adaptations of his work have been created including 11 television specials and a Broadway musical.

## Did you know.....

What the leaves of a shamrock symbolize?

One leaf is for FAITH...

The second is for HOPE...

The third for LOVE.....

The fourth for LUCK!



In Irish tradition—the shamrock or three-leaf clover—represents the Holy Trinity: one leaf for the Father, one for the Son and one for the Holy Spirit. When a shamrock is found with the fourth leaf, it represents God's Grace. Watch for sign-up sheets in your child's classroom so you can help them celebrate St. Patrick's Day.
